## McCormick recalls famous neighbors in Golden Valley

In a letter dated May 25, 2011, a returned Golden Valley resident writes:

"I've moved back to Golden Valley last year. Our family had two homes here, 4335 Tyrol Crest (1950-1962) and 800 South Meadow Lane (1962-1890). My parents built the home on Tyrol Crest in 1950. My father, then a young physician, walked across an empty lot to introduce himself to the neighbors who lived at 4435 Tyrol Crest. The owner was an attorney and the family had built the home a year or so earlier. During the time we lived there it was the Verbarg's house.

The owners were in the process of packing to move to Rochester, MN. where he was to be an attorney for the Mayo Clinic. He was Harry Blackman, who later became a U.S. Supreme Court Justice. He was also the author of one of the most controversial decisions of the last century, Roe V. Wade.

Also, during the time we moved to Meadow Lane, on a couple of occasions I met a guy my age (high school freshman) who was at Golden Valley High School and lived on Parkview Terrace, maybe 108 Parkview Terrace. I think he only attended there one year then

went to high school in Wisconsin. His name was Rick Flichr. He later became a very famous and popular professional wrestler, using the name Rick Flair. There is a lot of information on both of these persons on the internet, especially the wrestler."
