Rhees will reveal history of Earl Bakken, museum

The Bakken Museum, located at 3537 Zenith Avenue South in Minneapolis, was founded in 1975 by Earl Bakken, a Minneapolis native who discovered his passion for science at an early age. He was eight years old when he saw the film "Frankenstein" at a local theater, and watched in amazement as Dr. Frankenstein used science and electricity to bring the monster to life.

The movie inspired him to conduct his own experiments with electricity in the basement workshop of his childhood home. Bakken went on to study electrical engineering at the University of Minnesota and, in 1949, co-founded Medtronic with his brother-in-law. In 1957, he developed the first wearable, external, battery-powered pacemaker.

Dr. David Rhees is the Execu-

tive Director of the Bakken Museum and will present a program about the Museum and Earl Bakken. The meeting will be at 7:00 p.m., Thursday, January 12, at the Society's historic church and museum at 6731 Golden Valley Road, Golden Valley. It is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served following the program.

Golden Valley Hall of Fame inducts first five honorees

The first annual Golden Valley Hall of Fame project was a huge success. Honorees were inducted on Friday, December 2, at the 125th Anniversary of Golden Valley luncheon with 290 guests in attendance.

The 2011 inductees were: **Philip Brunelle**, who has spread his love of music all over the world; **Don Byerly**, whose entrepreneurial spirit and vision brought upscale food shopping to Golden Valley; **Betty Crocker**, an international symbol for all that home cooking can be fun, nutritious, easy and appealing; **Gleason Glover**, who worked tirelessly for equal treatment of all people; and **Robert Provost**, who sacrificed for his country and served his community all his life.

Brunelle and Byerly were able to accept their awards in person. The Crocker, Glover and Provost

awards were accepted on their behalf by representatives of General Mills and other family members. The Hall of Fame photo and stories will be placed on a plaque in the Golden Valley City Hall later this spring.

Tom Gillaspy, Minnesota State Demographer, was the keynote speaker at the luncheon. He talked about the demographic and economic history and future of Golden Valley and Minnesota. Rena Sari-gianopoulos of KARE 11 TV was the Master of Ceremonies.

On December 16, 1886, at a meeting in the old District 21 schoolhouse, the Town of Golden Valley was separated from Minneapolis Township by a vote of 78 to 1. On January 3, 1887, the village was organized under the provisions of Chapter 145 of the General Laws of 1885. Newly elected officers included Uriah Wilson, president,

John Scheid, Michael Rey, James Sweeney, William H. Varner, Jr. and William H. Varner, Sr.

The Hall of Fame inductions were one of many events of Golden Valley's 125th Anniversary Celebration during 2011. Future Anniversary celebrations will include installation of the Hall of Fame Inductees plaque and planting of the 25-year Time Capsule in the Golden Valley City Hall campus area.
